A successful International FASD day campaign for FARR

DE AAR – Focussing on the numerous challenges faced by young people today, the FARR (Foundation for Alcohol Related Research) Teams working in De Aar, Bristown, Hanover, Petrusville, Philipstown and Keurjieskloof decided to focus on grade 9 learners during the International Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Awareness Day on 9 September.

In De Aar permission was granted from the Department of Education to involve all four High Schools (Orion, De Aar, Monwabisi and Ventas) during the week leading up to International FASD Awareness Day. During the sessions at the schools in De Aar, Ms Meryll Smit (Project Coordinator for the De Aar Project) explained the symbolism behind having the day on the 9th day of the 9th month of the year, thereby reminding all involved that pregnant women should receive the necessary education and support to have nine alcohol-free pregnancy months. No alcohol is safe any time during pregnancy. Only by adhering to this, we will be able to prevent more children from being born with FASD in De Aar and the surrounding towns. As a reminder of this message a FASD knot is worn on participants chests. The learners therefore received a knot each and were asked to share the FASD prevention message with at least 9 other people.

The FARR Community Workers and Facilitators, Ms Nonkululeko Sithonga and Eldine Kok, Ms Lumka Mntwana and Ms Geraldine Esau, also did presentations at all the schools sharing a short message with the learners and providing them with resources.

FASD knoë, DITHIWI tati, a bottle of wine, and a lollipop with the message: As you eat this lollipop and it gets smaller in size, remember that alcohol during pregnancy can make you child's potential minimize. A programme was also offered at the De Aar Secure Centre involving all present, including the caretakers. The 36 participants actively participated in the programme. Raising awareness and sharing the FASD prevention message on a specific time every year, enables FARR to support this international drive to engage with as many community members as possible. Focussing on young people this year, we could share information and make them aware of how important it is to prevent unplanned pregnancies, drinking during pregnancy and ultimately preventing more children being born with this lifelong, irreversible condition.

We would like to thank the Department of Education for granting permission and providing support for this programme to be offered at the schools. Karoo Druppel provided each participant with a bottle of water, for which we are very grateful. Finally, we would like our funder Solar Capital De Aar for the on-going support and funding since 2014.
