Tapping into this, the FARR Team in De Aar, decided to have a positive focus for International Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Day on 9 September. Using the symbolic “9” in the date (9th of the 9th month), reminding all about the importance of nine-alcohol free months of pregnancy, the FARR Team enrolled nine households in a new residential area in De Aar to participate. Together with Tanja Fourie, colleagues and volunteers from the ACVV in De Aar, vegetables were planted in the gardens of these nine houses. In doing so, it was explained that by planting seeds, we can grow vegetables and produce some of our own food, creating a better tomorrow for our families. In December the gardens will be visited again by FARR and the ACVV to see which gardens were the most successful.

Prior to International FASD Day, FASD knots and awareness messages were also shared with local businesses in town. In 'n brief van AfriForum word die Emthanjeni-munisipaliteit versoek om die organisasie van 'n aksieplan te voorsien van hoe die munisipaliteit die watertekorte gaan oplos.

Dié brief is vandag (18 September) aan die munisipaliteit gestuur. AfriForum maan ook die munisipaliteit om al sy waterpunte van water te voorsien om verligting aan die gemeenskap te bring.

DE AAR – Afriforum doen 'n beroep op die Emthanjeni Plaaslike Munisipaliteit om dramgend by die waterkrisis in De Aar, Hanover en Bristown in te gryp. Die dorpe gaan al vir maande gebuk onder ernstige watertekorte.

In 'n brief van Afriforum word die Emthanjeni-munisipaliteit versoek om die organisasie van 'n aksieplan te voorsien van hoe die munisipaliteit die watertekorte gaan oplos.

Die brief is vandag (18 September) aan die munisipaliteit gestuur. Afriforum maan ook die munisipaliteit om al sy waterpunte van water te voorsien om verligting aan die gemeenskap te bring.

Die gebrek aan water in De Aar, Hanover en Bristown hou 'n groot gesondheidsrisiko in en toegang tot skoon water is 'n grondwetlike mensereg.

Afriforum is meer as bereid om die Emthanjeni-munisipaliteit te help en versoek 'n vergadering met die munisipaliteit om die saak verder te bespreek.

Die munisipaliteit het tot en met 25 September om op Afriforum se brief te reageer. Indien geen terugvoer teen dan ontvang is nie, sal verdere stappe oorweeg word.
