

# MISSION POSSIBLE

DE AAR – On 13 August FARR hosted their annual Alcohol Harm Reduction Seminar for the Pixley Ka Seme District in De Aar with the theme “Mission Possible”.

The seminar was targeted at professional service providers working in De Aar, Hanover and the Renosterberg areas. A total of 139 health workers, social workers, educators, police officers, NGO officials, etc from the Northern Cape provincial departments of Education, Social Development, and Health, as well as from the South African Police Service attended. Dr Jaco Louw (FARR’s Researcher/Monitoring and Impact Assessment Co-ordinator from Cape Town) was the keynote speaker. Dr. Louw has years of experience in FASD research. He shared some insight into what FASD is, but also about what can be done to support those living with FASD. He focused on different ways of thinking about FASD, and the negative impact of jokes and the language we use about drinking and motherhood. A key part of the discussion was the importance of support and not being judgmental towards mothers. All the participants enjoyed Dr. Louw’s presentation and his call to action in supporting pregnant women not to use alcohol during pregnancy as to prevent more babies being born with FASD.

After the keynote address, the St. John’s speaking choir did a touching performance. These learners’ beautiful and confident performance had the whole hall quiet and smiling. During the break the participants enjoyed coffee, tea and a slice of the famous FARR cake, which was cut by Ms Cornel Stevens (Hanover Project Coordinator) and Ms Kashifa van Syfer (Dietitian at Department of Health). Thereafter Ms Wilhelmina Manuel (Chairperson of Ethembeni Trauma Centre) gave a motivational talk and inspired everyone present. The final presentation was done by Ms Nadia Kuit (Social Worker at Solidariteit Helpende Hand Bo-Karoo). The day ended with a lively panel discussion where attendees joined an online poll to post questions to the panel members.

Ms Meryll Smit (De Aar Project Co-ordinator), who was the Master of Ceremonies for the day, ended of the day with a quote from Zig Ziglar: “Outstanding people have one thing in common: An absolute sense of Mission.” This was clearly evident amongst the attendees on the day.
